Hello Tiffany! Our 2024 Budget proposal was voted on and ratified by our membership on November 9, 2023 at the Annual Meeting. Some highlights for this new budget year include an increase to \$10,000 for us to fix and replace the

basketball hoop in our neighborhood park. We are also increasing our community entertainment/event budget so we can continue the popular events that have been ongoing these past couple of years. Lastly, a dues increase of 10% was approved to push out the annual dues amount to \$352.00. #### **CenCON 10/23/2023 Meeting Notes**

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

Tonight's meeting was combined with the quarterly Arapahoe County DA town hall update. Tiffany is in the 18th Judicial District with John Kellner being the current DA. Also, the Arapahoe County Sheriff, Tyler Brown was in attendance. There are currently 22 judicial districts in Colorado with the 18th, which comprises of Arapahoe, Douglas, Elbert, and Lincoln counties being the largest. As of January 2025, the 18th district will by only Arapahoe county and a 23rd district will be created comprising of Douglas, Elbert, and Lincoln counties.

Traditionally, felony crimes took about 225 days from the date of the crime to a resolution of a court judgment. Due to COVID, the time increased to about 350 days and is now being worked down to about 315 days. Mr. Kellner gave a few examples of violent crimes they have brought to conviction with Sheriff Brown adding some color. They addressed the current fentanyl problem and its large recent growth, large number of vehicle thefts and the increase in "mob" store robberies where store are overrun with a group of high speed robbers.

The Arapahoe Library District reported that there will be a "collectible" Koebel book sale on December 2nd and 3rd where children can also get their picture taken with Santa. There will be a performance of the Denver Dolls at the DTC Embassy Suites on December 21st at 6:30. They are a 1940's musical vocal group. (Register through Arapahoe Library).



#### Christmas Tree Cutting

Cutting down your own Christmas tree can be a memorable and festive experience for the whole family, but it's key to do this activity safely and legally. In Colorado, you typically need a permit to cut down a Christmas tree on public lands. Here are some spots where you can obtain a permit and some tips for doing this activity responsibly. All permits can be purchased online at recreation.gov.

- 1. Plan Ahead: Contact the forest service or visit their website for more information on permit availability, cutting dates, regulations, and designated cutting areas.
- 2. Choose the Right Tools: Bring a sharp saw for cutting and ropes or straps to secure the tree to your vehicle.
- 3. Select a Healthy Tree: A healthy tree will have vibrant green needles (avoid trees with brown or dry needles).
- 4. Dispose of the Tree Properly: Find a recycling program, chip the tree for mulch, or compost it.
