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CenCon 11/28/22 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

The Arapahoe Sheriff Ken McKlem again reported that the #1 crime in Centennial is vehicle theft and theft from vehicle break-ins (usually unlocked doors). Be sure to always lock your car doors, especially when a car is parked on the street.

Lindsay Robinson of South Suburban relayed that from December 1st to January 2nd, many classes will have reduced sale prices and be sure to check the website for more details. There will be South Suburban Board elections on May 2, 2023.

The main topic of the evening was a presentation by the Community Associations Institute – Rocky Mountain Chapter (CAI-RMC). The speakers were Karli Phifer (president-elect) and Jeff Kutzer (outgoing president). CAI-RMC mainly represents HOAs and management companies in educating its members and being a unified voice when HOA issues arise. The current spot-lighted issue is the newly in-acted House Bill 22-1137 which impacted the governance of HOAs and can override existing covenants. It was viewed as having many poorly written items in the bill and CAI-RMC is part of a lobbying effort to introduce amendments to the original bill. HOAs can join the association for about \$300/year.

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Apply for an Animal License

All dogs over the age of six months must be licensed with the City of Centennial. Owners have thirty (30) days from the date the dog is brought into the City to get a license. Licensing Fees

- One year, spayed or neutered \$12
- One year, unaltered \$24
- Three year, spayed or neutered \$30
- Three year, unaltered \$67

**Residents age 65 and older can call 303-325-8070 to get one free dog license per household each year with proof of age.


