CenCON 5/22/23 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

Gerry Cummins, who has been the Cencon president for the last 15 years, has stepped down and C.J. Whelan has taken her place as the Cencon president.


Kristin Eckmann of the South Metro Fire Rescue reported that 120 women attended the Mile High Women's Leadership Conference in May that focused on the importance of health and wellness in fire service careers. Fire station #15 (on Dry Creek across from Tiffany) will be demolished in July. The new fire station will be completed in the Fall of 2024 at a cost of \$8 million. The medical unit will be temporarily located at fire station #14 (6600 S. Colorado) and the fire engine at station #37 (in Greenwood Village). The station will be used for training in the month of June before the demolition.

SB213, which deals with the state taking control of zoning from the cities, was defeated recently but will be reintroduced next year according to interviews with the governor.

District 3 Council Member of Centennial Mike Sutherland discussed the Centennial Housing Study. The study focuses on the Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) which would allow for small stand alone living structures to be built on existing single family lots depending on the size of the lot. This concept met with considerable resistance from those at attendance. The ADU push is trying to address the housing shortage in the Denver area but many factors need to be ironed out and a workable path of implementation is not apparent at this time.

The remainder of the time was spent discussing the future direction of CenCON meetings and trying to define how to focus subject matter to make items pertinent to the running of the existing HOAs.

Replacing Hummingbird Water

In hot weather, the feeder should be emptied and cleaned twice per week. In cooler weather, once per week is enough. If your hummingbirds empty the feeder with greater frequency, clean it every time it's empty. Cleaning with hot tap water works fine, or use a weak vinegar solution. Avoid using dish soaps, as this can leave harmful residue in the feeder. For more information see, audubon.org/news/hummingbird-feeding-faqs.
