### **CenCon 1/23/2023 Meeting Notes**

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

The Arapahoe County Deputy DA Jacob Kremin announced the Human Trafficking Awareness program. The average age of the victims are 13 years of age and are usually homeless or of a dysfunctional family. The problem has become serious in the Denver Area. The South Metro Fire District reported that station #15, near Tiffany on Dry Creek, will be closed in March or April for rebuilding and will reopen in 2024. Also, its Citizen's Academy six week school (one night per week), held from March 2 to April 22, is accepting applications. It is free of charge and teaches/demonstrates activities of the firefighters and paramedics to district residents. Slots for this are limited.

Don Sheehan of the Centennial City Council explained snow removal policies. P1 streets (main streets) total 278 lane-miles and take 10 trucks 1.75 hours to plow once. The P2 streets (feeder to main streets) total 300 lane-miles and take 10 trucks 5.5 hours to plow once. P1 and P2 streets are plowed at every significant snow event. P3 streets (residential streets) total 549 lane-miles and will be plowed at the discretion of the city manager and is usually at 6 inches of snow or more. This is contracted out and is done by a pickup truck with a blade. The city will take care of larger ice build-up problem areas if they are contacted.

The Tri-county health district has been dissolved and as of January 1, 2023, the Arapahoe County Health district was formed. It is primarily in charge of restaurant and day care inspections etc. and is trying to define its role beyond that. Visit https://www.arapahoegov.com/2250/Public-Health for more details.

### **Senior Property Tax Exemption**

The exemption is available to applicants who: a) are at least 65 years of age as of January 1 of the year of application, b) owned their home for at least 10 consecutive years as of January 1, and c) occupy it as their primary residence and have done so for at least 10 consecutive years as of January 1. The exemption is also available to surviving spouses of senior citizens who previously met the requirements. You can get the application through Arapahoe County.

### **Spring Lawn Maintenance**

Be sure to aerate your lawn this spring. This will allow the grass to more quickly absorb both water and fertilizer. Consider your watering schedule. It is ideal to water to a greater depth less frequently as this keeps the roots strong. Many new commercial irrigation controllers offer an easy way to do this.

When mowing, you may want to keep your grass a bit longer and mow a little more frequently. This provides protection for the roots and maintains more moisture in the soil. After the first spring growth spurt, you may also want to use a thatching mower and not bag the grass. This provides more nutrients – and more water retention – for the soil.

### Happy St. Patrick's Day!

Unless you've been living under the Blarney Stone you already know that March 17 is St. Patrick's Day. Also affectionately known as St. Paddy's Day or St. Patty's Day, it's the one day each year that everyone and anyone can call themselves Irish – if not by birthright, then in spirit. If you have been living under the Blarney Stone, lucky you! We bet you can share a thing or two about how a religious feast day commemorating the famed Irish patron saint who brought Christianity to Ireland ended up being a day celebrated almost globally, usually involving copious amounts of green beer and whisky shooters.

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated in more countries around the world than any other single-day national festival, largely due to America's enthusiasm for what many consider a holiday, although it is not an official holiday in America.

Parades are the heartbeat of St. Patrick Day festivities in America. This is not surprising, since the first parade held in St. Patrick's honor took place in America, not Ireland, in 1601 in what is now St. Augustine, Florida. And the first actual St. Patrick's Day parade also took place in America, in 1737, although it was pretty much just a stroll down the middle of a street in Boston by a few Irish Protestants to honor the patron saint of their motherland. The first St. Patrick's Day parade in New York City was held in 1762, 14 years before the signing of the Declaration of Independence, and was organized by Irish troops serving in British colonies. Today the world's biggest St. Patrick's Day celebration is the annual parade in New York City, where more than two million spectators line the parade route, all claiming to be Irish, at least for the day.


