CenCON 3/27/2023 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member. The South Metro Fire Rescue reported that in 2022 they handled over 50,000 calls. 9,000 were in Centennial and medical issues were 60% of total calls. Fire Station #15 on Dry Creek will be shut at the end of May and will hold an open house

> at that time for residents to attend. It will be torn down, and be rebuilt.

Arapahoe Park and Recreation will investigate options for xeriscaping and said they plan a "Big Announcement" in 4 months. Stay tuned. The Arapahoe Library District reminded people that they offer reduced prices to many events around town such as museums, the zoo and such through the Happy Mother's Day "Exploration Pass" program. Our city council representative, Richard Holt

reported that new "Pickle Ball" court construction is being temporarily stopped to study the issues with noise caused by the sport. Lifetime Fitness plans for new courts has the adjacent neighborhood concerned. I had no idea of the apparent explosion in pickle ball popularity. The SouthGlenn YMCA is due to open May 1st.

Deputy District Attorney Jacob Kremin gave a presentation on human trafficking. Denver ranks as the 3rd worst city for this problem in the nation. The average age of victims is 13 years old. It was depressing to listen to. Public awareness of the problem is essential. If you see young kids apparently homeless or in need, contact the DA's office and they direct the report to the proper agency.

May and June are the months when honeybees typically swarm. Swarms can be found on branches or even on the ground. Swarming is a natural occurrence when the bees in the hive are doing well and feel too crowded. If you see a swarm, don't harm it! Call the Colorado swarm hotline at 1-844-SPY-BEES (844-779-2337). Take a pic, note the location, and call ASAP. Time is critical because the bees are typically just resting on the branch/ground while scouting for a permanent home. — Debbie Rasor

More Information On New Southglenn YMCA Generations

YMCA and City of Centennial have announced the soft opening of a new "Centennial YMCA Center of Generations" to offer a range of programs for all ages.

The 6,345 square foot center, located in The Streets at SouthGlenn 6851 S. Vine Street, will build community by bringing together youth and older adults in a multi-generational space. The Center of Generations will be open to the public and initial offerings will begin in early May with plans to be fully operational in summer 2023.

The YMCA of Metro Denver will operate and establish programming at the center, including fitness activities – like Silver Sneakers, a wellness program for older adults – and an array of other programs such as cooking classes, esports, and a Youth in Government program.

Esports, or competitive video gaming, is popular with middle and high schoolers and sanctioned just last year by the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA) with its first Rocket League state championship. The new center will bring 11- to 18-year-olds into the space to help them with their game skills. This esports program will also function as the pilot for the rest of YMCA of Metro Denver.

Area youth interested in the real-life inner workings of state government will also have the opportunity to participate in the YMCA's Youth in Government program. Younger Centennial citizens interested in law, journalism or government are encouraged to join the three-month program to learn and explore by taking on the roles of politicians, lobbyists, attorneys, and journalists.



This effort is a result of collaboration by the City of Centennial and the YMCA with the City Council and Senior and Youth Commissions leading the collaboration to recommend programs for the space.


