CenCON 7/24/2023 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

This month the meeting was held off site at the Douglas/Arapahoe Counties Sheriff's Training Facility which is located south of Triton Road on Sante Fe in Douglas County. The facility was established in 1987 and is used by over 90 law enforcement agencies around the country because it is known for its superior and spacious shooting ranges and other amenities. The facility is 100% booked year round. Sergeant Cole James and Captain Ken McKlem explained the training requirements for the Arapahoe County law enforcement officers. A tour of the facilities followed.

Arapahoe County has approximately 560 deputies on staff along with other higher ranking officers. The attrition rate has been on the order of 60 deputies per year which means training activities are constant. New recruits receive 9 months of training (5 months in the training facility and 4 months in the field such as in jail or riding with a partner etc.). In addition, each officer in Arapahoe County is required to take 80 hours yearly and pass yearly state accreditation. A single academy (or class) holds approximately 30 to 35 recruits. As you can imagine, the number of pertinent topics is huge, from radar, search, arresting, body cams, CPR etc. etc. With police being under such media scrutiny, you can imagine the need for top notch and current training to get things right under sometimes very stressful situations.

FALL BIRDING FESTIVAL AT BARR LAKE Barr Lake State Park, Brighton
