CenCON 8/28/2023 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

- Pickleball was again in the news. Lifetime Fitness has pickleball courts near residential dwellings and the people near these courts are unhappy with the noise. We will have to see how this plays out (pun intended). The Arapahoe Road bridge construction is now set to conclude at the end of this year. Orchard Road is being widened west of Colorado and is due to be finished in the Spring of 2024.
- A representative of the YMCA Center of Generations at SouthGlenn told us about the older adult programs available. Youth programs are also available. Visit https://denverymca. org/centennial-center-generations for more information.
- Ryan Thompson is the Centennial Neighborhood Service Manager who is over 1) Code Compliance: the number of officers has been increased from 6 to 12 to enforce things such as restaurant cleanliness for example among many other items. This would also include the 87 short term rentals (VRBO etc.) in Centennial. 2) Neighborhood Engagement Grants: of \$500 to fund small events so neighbors and get to know one another (Tiffany has participated in this program). 3) Neighbor Mediation: to help HOAs mediate messy neighbor quarrels. 4) Movie Night Grants. 5) Large Community improvement Grants: which targets sprucing up HOA entrances with attractive signs etc. Grants can be as large as \$10,000. 6) Animal Services: which is generically "dog catching". The scope of this city service is domesticated animals only. Pets should be registered with the city and we were reminded to keep the rabies shots updated.

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Local Pumpkin Patches

Anderson Farms, Erie, CO

Known as one of Colorado's longest-running corn mazes and pumpkin patches, Anderson Farms has become a northeast Colorado favorite fall attraction. Located in Erie, Anderson Farms not only boasts the biggest pumpkin patch in Colorado but also has gourd launching displays, pony rides, a playground, and a farm stand. Take a hayride to the pumpkin

patch where you can choose from over 26 varieties of squash, pumpkins and gourds. And for the thrill-seekers they have Terror in the Corn where you can explore 10 acres of fear.

Cottonwood Farms, Lafayette, CO

Cottonwood Farms not only has a well-stocked pumpkin patch but also

features a corn maze, farm animals, straw-bale maze and hayrides. This farm, which offers free admission during weekdays and \$5 on Saturday and Sunday, is a destination for both fall produce and Christmas trees from Thanksgiving to Christmas.

Colorado Pumpkin Patch, Monument, CO

The Colorado Pumpkin Patch, a family-friendly farm, provides families with a stellar pumpkin patch, outdoor laser tag, gourd target practice, a petting zoo, mazes, and of course a hayride. This pumpkin patch recommends choosing pumpkins Oct. 1-20, ensuring that you get the best selection. Guests will not find scary activities on this farm, making it perfect for a fall family outing.





Denver Botanic Gardens Chatfield Farms, Littleton, CO

At Denver Botanic Gardens, Chatfield Farms boasts a 10-acre pumpkin patch and an seven-acre corn maze. A minimaze is even offered for small children to enjoy. Guests can drop their pumpkins off at the pumpkin daycare while they enjoy the rest of Chatfield Farms.

Rock Creek Farm, Broomfield, CO

Rock Creek Farm in Broomfield wows guests with a 100-acre pumpkin patch and six miles of corn mazes. But that isn't all: Rock Creek also has a petting zoo, pumpkin carving, straw bales and more. After a few hours of fall fun at Rock Creek, don't forget to snack on their famous caramel apples and pumpkin desserts.

Mile High Farms, Bennett, CO

Mile High Farms impresses guests with not just its eclectic pumpkin patch, but also the farm's two corn mazes, a petting zoo, inflatable bounce castles, hayride and even face painting. Find pumpkins in wide variety, from baking pumpkins to whimsical Cinderella pumpkins. This Bennett farm is perfect for fall family fun.

Miller Farms, Platteville, CO

A family-run business for generations, Miller Farms offers a pumpkin patch, petting zoo, corn maze and hayrides through 180-acres of fields where you can pick your own vegetables. Guests can also learn about the true nature of farm life with their farm tours. The Annual Fall Festival is a popular time to visit this Platteville farm.

RV Parking

Just a quick reminder concerning the parking of RVs, Campers, Trailers, Boats from our HOA Covenants, Policies and Procedures:

- No boats, campers, trailers, trucks, recreational vehicles, or other vehicles of a similar type or nature shall be parked or stored in or on any street within the property or common areas of these properties.
- No boats, campers, trailers, trucks, recreational vehicles, or other vehicle of a similar type or nature shall be parked or stored on any lot, except in the garage area or within a screen enclosure situation in the rear or side of the dwelling improvement construction on said lot, which screen enclosure was prior to its erection approved by the Association's ACC.
- The Tiffany HOA Board established a rule allowing 72 hours for the parking of vehicles described in Article VII, paragraph one, of the Declaration of Covenants Conditions and Restrictions. Homeowners wishing to park such a vehicle for more than 72 hours must request a variance to the covenants and policies. This request must be made in writing to a member of the ACC, and the request must include a description of the vehicle, where it is to be parked, how long the homeowner is requesting it to be parked, and the purpose of the parking. The ACC will use its discretion in the granting or the withholding of the variance.

LPS Rezoning Proposals

Littleton Public School has Long-Range Planning Committees POTENTIAL rezoning proposals. A few different proposals rezoning The Knolls and/or Tiffany and/or Cherry Knolls are being considered, in which our kids would attend Powell (nearly three miles away) instead of Newton (within walking distance). Homeowners that do not have middle school age children should still consider getting involved as this has potential to affect the resale of your home.

Please be a voice against these proposed changes by emailing the LPS Board of Education (boardofeducation@lps.k12.co.us) with your thoughts and personal directives on why you would like your children/family to remain at Newton Middle School. The Board of Education forwards all emails regarding proposed boundary changes directly to the Long Range Planning Committee.
